How to effectively apply emollients

How to apply1

Apply gently by smoothing into the skin in the direction of hair growth.*



Be careful to avoid contact with eyes. If product does accidentally come in contact with eyes, rinse well with water and seek medical advice.

How much to apply¹

Apply emollients liberally using as much product as needed to manage symptoms.

At least 500g per week for adults At least 250g per week for children.



How often to apply¹

Apply emollients as often as required.



Body wash^{2,3}

EPIMAX® emollients can be used as a non-foaming body wash to cleanse and moisturise the skin.

- Mix a small amount (around a teaspoonful) in the palm of your hand with a little warm water and spread it over your skin
- Rinse and pat the skin dry, being careful not to rub it (this could trigger: itching, blocked hair follicles or create more heat in the skin)

Bath additive³



To help keep skin hydrated, melt 4g of **EPIMĂX®** Ointment in hot water and add to your bath.*

Tips¹

- Use your emollient even when symptoms have improved to help prevent flare-ups
- For extra hydration, apply after bathing, while water is still trapped in the skin

How to apply emollients in the sun4

In sunny weather where SPF needs to be worn, apply the emollient 30 minutes before applying



Choose an emollient that is lower down on the Emollient Ladder, as emollients with high oil content can accelerate burning.
